# Do you have communication needs?

It is the law for the NHS and social care providers to help you understand information about your health and social care under the Accessible Information Standard

# Here are 5 things NHS and Social Care services must do for you:



Record

They should make sure these needs are recorded on your notes





They should flag and alert staff your requirements



The service should be communicating about your care, your way to meet your needs





If you agree, the service should share with other services your requirements

**If your needs aren't being met** tell the service. It's your right to receive information in a way you understand.

On Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> June, you can find them at Ferryhill Market Place from 9:30-4pm where the following services will be available to speak to:

Sunderland and Durham Royal Society for the Blind
Durham County Council Sensory Support Team

Durham County Council will have information for you to take away and a variety of equipment aids they can demonstrate to help overcome some hurdles for people who have vision and hearing impairments. There is also space on the bus for anyone needing to chat about the services on offer and they can take referrals too.

It will be based in the Melissa Bus, which is a double decker bus parked in Ferryhill Market Place.
